November 2: "Be Clear About Things," Col. 4:2-4; And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should.

Verse 2 - A Life of Prayer

- Paul calls believers to persist in prayer, not just pray occasionally.
- "Watchful" implies being alert and spiritually aware, paying attention to what God is doing.
- Thanksgiving keeps prayer grounded in gratitude, not just requests.

Verse 3 - Praying for the Mission

- Paul asks the church to pray for open doors for the gospel.
- The message is called the "mystery of Christ" — God's redemptive plan now revealed through Jesus.
- Even while imprisoned, Paul's concern is not comfort but opportunity to share Christ.

Verse 4 - Clarity in Proclaiming Christ

- Paul emphasizes the importance of clarity, not confusion.
- The gospel should be communicated in a way that is understandable and faithful.
- Clear speech is part of Christian responsibility — how we speak matters.
