Verse 5

- Believers are called to live wisely, especially around those who do not share their faith.
- “Outsiders” refers to those outside the Christian community.
- Making the most of every opportunity means recognizing daily moments as chances to reflect Christ through actions and choices.

Verse 6

- Words should be spoken with grace, showing kindness and care.
- “Seasoned with salt” suggests speech that is thoughtful, engaging, and meaningful.
- Our conversations should help us respond to others in a way that is appropriate and loving.
